<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Literary works</li> <li>▪ Musical works, including any accompanying words</li> <li>▪ Dramatic works, including any accompanying music</li> <li>▪ Pantomimes and choreographic works</li> <li>▪ Pictorial, graphic and sculptural works</li> <li>▪ Motion pictures and other audiovisual works</li> <li>▪ Sound recordings</li> <li>▪ Architectural works</li> <li>▪ Software</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Works that have not been fixed in a tangible form of expression—written, recorded or captured electronically.</li> <li>▪ Titles, names, short phrases and slogans; familiar symbols or designs; mere variations of typographic ornamentation, lettering or coloring; mere listings of ingredients or contents.</li> <li>▪ Ideas, procedures, methods, systems, processes, concepts, principles, discoveries or devices, as distinguished from a description, explanation or illustration.</li> <li>▪ Works consisting entirely of information that are natural or self-evident facts, containing no original authorship, such as telephone books, standard calendars, height and weight charts and tape measures and rulers.</li> <li>▪ Works created by the U.S. Government.</li> <li>▪ Works for which copyright has expired; works in the public domain.</li> </ul>
