
WHAT'S NEW WITH RIGHTSLINK FOR SCIENTIFIC COMMUNICATIONS

We are pleased to share notes from the latest RightsLink for Scientific Communications release, which released on 18 November 2020.

Removal of Hover Information; All Details Now Displayed On-Screen

Previously, some pieces of information about your funding requests (author affiliation info, grant IDs) were found by hovering over areas of the dashboard. It was brought to our attention that this is not intuitive for new users and they often miss these details. Users suggested it would be better if all pieces of data about a manuscript/request were displayed clearly on the dashboard or expanded details, without needing to hover the mouse over specific areas to see more.


We have responded to this feedback by slightly altering the dashboard to make room for all data. Now you will see the full primary author name, contact and affiliation details in the main display of the dashboard, and all funder/grant ID elements brought into the expanded details section.

Added "Type of Open Access" to the Funding Request Dashboard

We also recognize that many 2021 agreements are basing their funding eligibility, special pricing, and more on whether the manuscript is being published in a pure or hybrid open access journal. RightsLink recently enabled tools for publisher's to identify their journals as either pure or hybrid open access, so we have extended this information to the institutions' funding request dashboard (when available) so that this information is readily available during funding decisions.
